- Launched in 1998 by Larry Page & Sergey Brin in a garage.
 - just 5 years after the birth of the World Wide Web
 - in a neighbor's garage in Menlo Park, CA
- How did the name come about:
 - was named after a googol—the name for the number 1 followed by 100 zeros
 - found in the book Mathematics and the Imagination by Edward Kasner and James Newman
- To the site's founders, the name represents the immense amount of information that a search engine has to sift through.

Alphabet is now the "parent" company and was created in October 2015 under a corporate restructuring of Google and subsidiaries.




Current Google Services:
