


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Zoom Protocols

LASTPASS?????

The breach of LastPass.

Do I need to leave and use a different Password Manager?

Okay, so LastPass, our "trusted" keeper of things we can't forget has kerfuffled big time.

They were BREACHED in August.

LastPass did not disclose the full extent of the damage until the beginning of December 2022.

Now what do we do?



I must say I was quite disappointed and rather miffed at the news. When I first started using LastPass the original owners would not have let this happened.

Sold to LinkedIn in 2015 and then, LinkedIn decided to split it off and make it an independent company. They got sloppy.

CHOICES

Well, if you have a long and complicated Master Password for LastPass, it is unlikely the thieves will ever be able to crack the encryption for that. Yes, your ENCRYPED vault data was "captured", but it is extremely difficult to unencrypt.

You can choose to stay with LastPass, but I would recommend you go through your list and change EVERY password you have and, perhaps you may want to use the auto-generated password option.



You may choose to leave LastPass and that is also a good thing. There are a number of options in Password Management.

Here are just a few suggested by those sites:

Dashlane, RoboForm, 1 Password, Apple iCloud Keychain (for Mac users), Google Chrome or MS Edge or Firefox browser security, KeePass, and Bitwarden.

I have chosen to work with Bitwarden. I could not seem to get it to work well in the free version, but at \$10 annually, I am using the paid version.



Bitwarden is relatively easy to setup. Be SURE to create a strong Master Password when you set up your account.

Bitwarden is compatible with Windows, macOS, Linux operating systems. Compatible extensions for use in browsers: Chrome, Edge, Safari, Firefox, Opera, Brave, Vivaldi, Tor and DuckDuckGo for Mac.

Bitwarden apps are available in both the Apple App Store and the Google Play Store.



I've been working with and learning Bitwarden over the last few days. I'm finding that it doesn't "flow" as easily for me as LastPass does. I wanted to be able to share with our members one of several options available for a transfer.

Do be careful and only click once to import the data. I ended up with 5 copies of each password after playing with it a while.

The same data file can be used in other options as well.



But first you may be wondering how to get your data out of LastPass. I've made a short video with instructions:

And now that you have exported your data and after you have imported the data to your new Password Manager of choice, put it somewhere safe... a password protected file or an external drive. You could print it out, but it may use LOTS of paper..

I will be sharing how I imported my data into Bitwarden.

I would recommend trying a new Password Manager before paying for it. Be sure to read the instructions for importing data available in the help or support section.



When you have set up your new account and are ready to import your data, here is how I did it in Bitwarden

Once the import process has taken place, regardless of which Password Manager you have chosen, even if you decide to stay with LastPass, take the time to go through and update your passwords. It may take a few days or even a few weeks, but it is most certainly worth it to be on the safe side.
