

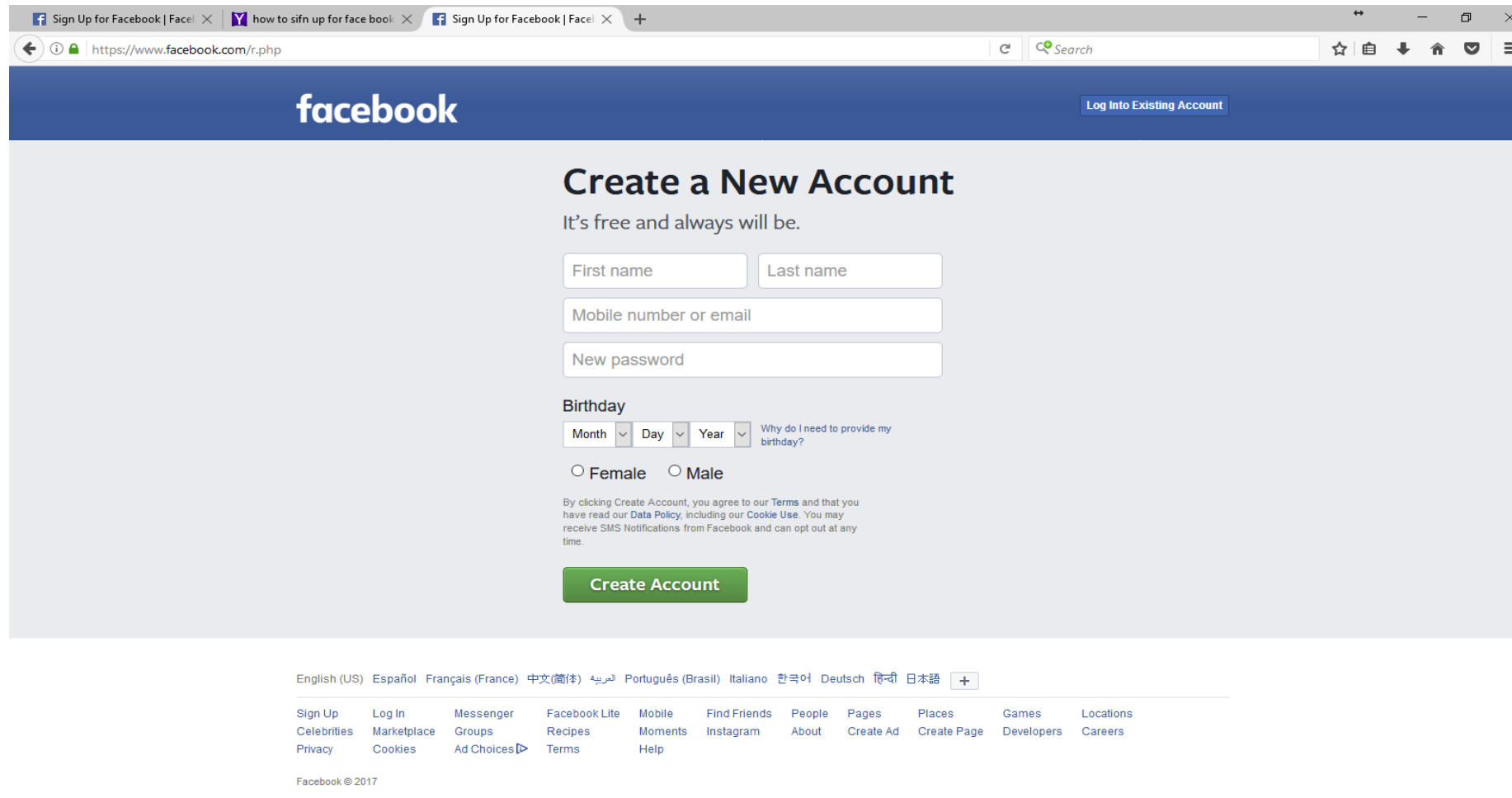

Let's get started and set up a new account. First you enter your first and last name. You can include your maiden name if you want, so old friends can find you. Then you need to decide what email or phone number you want to use. Finally, you need a password that is easy to remember BUT hard to guess. Enter your birthdate and gender. Click on create account



Enter all the information as shown, and then click “create account”.




Ok you made it in!! Now let's look around.

You have many choices when it comes to seeing your posts. You probably want friends to see most posts, but you can make a post that only you can see, or you can select certain people for some posts.

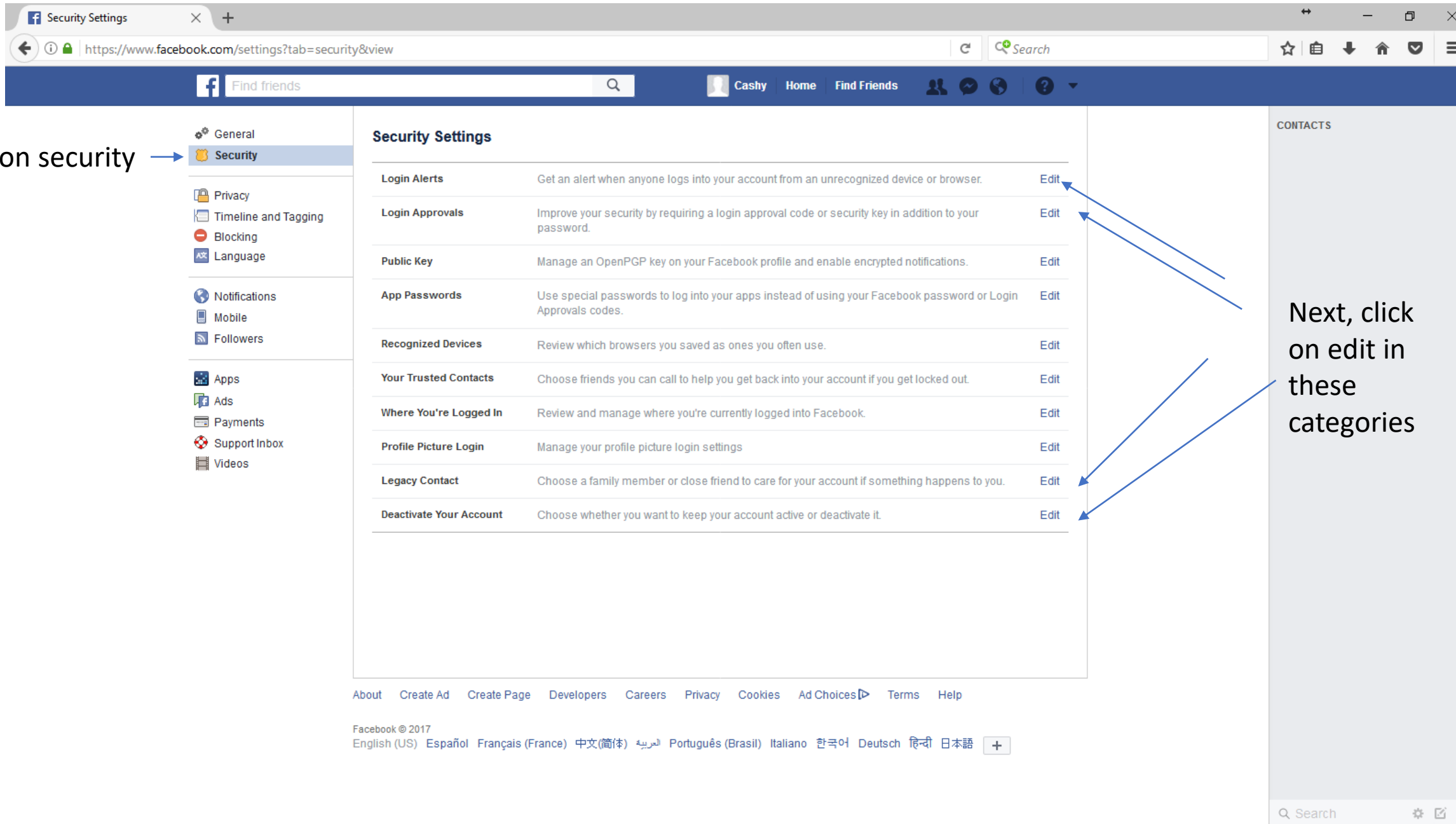

Legacy Contact - A legacy contact is someone you choose to look after your account if it's [memorialized](#).

Blocking people, messages and other things. This page is handy if you are being bothered by someone. Most settings are self explanatory.

Now let's get to work on our profile

Next add a cover photo. Click on Add Photo or click on the camera icon. You can then upload a photo choose from one you have already uploaded. Tip: Now you can change who can see your old cover photos - just go to your [Cover Photos album](#). You can change the privacy on each one.

Add a photo of yourself. It is easy. Click on Add Photo or click OK. You can then upload a photo or take one with your camera.

Let's add some details about you. This is also based on personal preference. Click on each section and add what you want.
